- Description: The second people to assess their readiness to work in tobacco control.
- Establishing a coordinating center of tobacco control learning, communication, and policy activities among Tribal communities, organizations and agencies as well as Al-serving organizations and agencies.
- Providing training and skill development to build the capacity of tribal leaders, emerging leaders, and champions in the tobacco education arena.
- Developing and disseminating a policy platform that identifies policy and system change priorities for preventing and reducing tobacco use among California's AI population.
- Creating paid media for California Tribal Communities and American Indian media outlets including radio, print, out-of-home, closed circuit health channels, and digital media in collaboration with the statewide tobacco media campaign.
